

## MURDOCK'S SIDING



## Nov. 2016 Contest


The November 2016 contest was *Passenger Car*. Unfortunately, there were only two entries, so the contest was cancelled. Below are the two contest entries.



Robert Allen entered this HO-Scale, Gorre & Daphetid Railroad passenger car, named, *Great Divide*. It features an N-scale lighting kit, interior details, and a carpet that is actually fabric ribbon.



John Emmot entered this HO-scale, Denver Northwestern & Pacific Railroad coach passenger car, #703. The prototype was built by the Saint Charles Car Company for the Chesapeake Beach Railway in 1899. It was then rebuilt by the D.N.W.&.P.R.R., in Denver, early in 1904. This model features custom laser-cut sides and clerestory with LaBelle Woodworking Kit HO-1. It has Central Valley T-25 trucks, Kadee couplers, and custom Alps decals.
