


NOVEMBER 2015

MEETING MINUTES

The last meeting was on Friday, November 13th, 2015.

The meeting was called to order by Superintendent, Wade Mountz, on Friday, November 13th, 2015, at the Sand Creek Police Station, 4125 Center Park Drive (southeast of the intersection of Fountain and Academy), Colorado Springs, Colorado, at 7:03 PM. There was one new visitor — John Kern — from Virginia and models mainly in HO-scale.

The minutes for the October 2015 meeting were approved as written in *The Milepost*.

Frank Pareso gave the Treasurer's report and there was no old business to be resolved.

Kristin Phillips asked if gift cards had been purchased and given to the staff present when our group toured the Fort Carson Army Base Railroad. It was reported that this had been taken care of.

Wade presented several awards to Don Bailey — a former superintendent of our division. Don received merit awards for scenery work, module work, a three-way stub-switch, a crossing, and a turnout. Don then gave a speech about the NMRA's A.P. program and his involvement in the NMRA.

Wade reminded everyone that our next meeting is the Christmas party and we'll have the election of officers. Jerry Bonds is moving back to Ohio in April 2016 and the position of Contest Chairman will be open. He will help anyone interested until April 2016. Dennis Snyder expressed interest in this position. Wade also asked if there were any officers that didn't want to continue in their current positions — no one said anything. Wade reported that next year will be his last year as superintendent.

Dusty Thompson gave a post-show update on the October 17th, 2015 swap meet. He said it was a really good show all around with full table sales. Dusty proposed a motion of giving the church \$250.00 for the use of their facilities. The motion passed. Dusty is looking at sometime in May 2016 — thinking we will not have a second show later in 2016 because of the RMR convention in October 2016. Dusty also suggested that we just put date stickers on the cards left over from the last show to advertise the May 2016 show. Frank reported on the financials concerning the swap meet. Dusty will work on getting the May 2016 date.

Andy Buco gave an update on the TECO shows. Themes have been decided on:

- TECO #27 will be April 23-24; the theme will be for the Florence & Cripple Creek Railroad.
- TECO #28 will be June 18-19 (Father's Day Weekend); the theme will be for the Midland Terminal Railroad.
- There will be no September show because of the RMR's October 2016 convention;
- TECO #29 will be December 2-4, 2016 the theme will be for the Colorado Springs & Cripple Creek District Railroad (a.k.a. The Short Line).

John Emmot gave a report on how module group did at the Slim Rail show in Woodland Park, Colorado went. John and the rest of the group also talked about adding lights to the modules in the PPD Module Group.

Dennis Snyder gave an update on gathering birth dates as needed for the NMRA's survey. He will send out an e-mail to those members who don't have their birth date listed.

Kristen Phillips mentioned an article in the NMRA maga-

zine that discussed ideas to get younger members to be interested in and join the NMRA.

Gerry Drews mentioned that he had fliers for the Pikes Peak & Southern Railroad module group setting up at the Fine Arts Center. Anyone can run trains — please contact Gerry Drews at 570-9559 or Jerry Bonds at 570-1600. [Please see the flier in the Inserts Section for more information].

Alan Hutchins mentioned that Terry Sharpton had passed away back in January 2015. He was known for running the Colorado Rail Link module group in the Denver area. His family is selling off his collection.

Short break in the meeting for refreshments and voting.

Frank gave out the door prizes. Frank also talked about renewing the division to use the same meeting room and general dates/times for next year.

Alan Hutchins gave a presentation called, *Train Story*, that show cased a large variety of different kinds of train cars, engines, and other railroad-related items.

Wade reviewed next month's Christmas party meeting.

Alan discussed his PowerPoint presentation and took questions regarding his presentation after the meeting.

Jerry Bonds gave out the awards for the modeling contest [please see the "November 2015 Contest Entries" column for the award results].

Meeting ended at 8:53 PM.

NOVEMBER 2015 CONTEST ENTRIES

November's contest was *Kit-Built M.O.W. Equipment*. The models that were entered are shown below.



Dennis Snyder won first-place with two MOW models — a narrow gauge flatcar with a load and a standard gauge boxcar/flatcar combination railcar.



Wade won second-place with this three car, Santa Fe, HO-scale MOW train that includes a flatcar, crane car, and crane tender.



Jerry Hanz won third-place with these four MOW, HO-scale, Santa Fe railcars. The crane tender (flatcar), ATSF 257893 is an Athearn kit that was built in 1999 — repainted in Santa Fe silver, added decals, added weathered wheel sets, and installed Kadee couplers. The crane car (200 ton buckeye), ATSF 199791 is an Athearn kit built in 1977 — basic kit work and installed Kadee couplers. The Jordan spreader, yellow, ATSF 526628, is from the 2007 PPD Christmas party — added rust to blades and installed Kadee couplers. The crane tender, lower-right, is an unknown kit manufacturer, built in 1977 — repainted Santa Fe silver, added decals, added spare trucks, and installed Kadee couplers.

CONTEST SCHEDULE

Contest entries are submitted and judged at each monthly meeting based on the schedule below. There must be at least three entries for there to be a contest to be judged.

December No contest (Christmas Party).



Tony Pawlicki entered this nicely detailed, HO-scale, Herzog gondola model, HZGX 1190. This Walthers kit was assembled with the following modifications: coil cradle was omitted (not appropriate for MOW use); added uncoupling lever and bracket, added hand brake chain; replaced vertical pulling loops with horizontal pulling loops; added Automatic Equipment Identification (AEI) transponder in second panel from the right; and painted the trucks, grab irons, and wheel sets. Some of the underbody detail that interfered with the free swinging of the trucks was removed.







The clue, highlighted in Figure #2, was the train you can see *behind* the BNSF train crossing the bridge.



Our layout uses both analog DC control, and Digital DCC control, with engines that have onboard processors that only respond to instructions sent directly to them.

In addition to our open houses, we have club meetings every Thursday night at 7pm. visitors are welcome to come to the auditorium on Thursday nights to view the layout.

WHAT WE DO:



PURPOSES & OBJECTIVES: The purposes and objectives of the Club are as follows:


1. To provide a meeting place for interested model railroaders;
