



The last meeting was on Friday, March 11th, 2016.


- 1. Call to order at 7:06 PM 23 members in attendance.

We will have the usual control options available; DC, DCC with wired, wireless and wifi. I hope to see a big turnout for this event. 



July Weathered Diesel Operated Equipment (for track or other use).


August...... Weathered Steam Operated Equipment (for track or other use).
