

SUPERINTENDENT'S NOTES

We love trains — the miniature ones we watch or run, the full size ones we can ride and the ones we see running along the Front Range. But with that awe comes a large message of respect.

Those of use who work with Operation Lifesaver got a reminder of the importance of getting across our life and death message on railroad safety this past March.

In Navasota, Texas, a mother of a 19-year-old girl says her daughter was killed by a train while having photographs taken of her on the tracks as she tried to launch a career in modeling.

Mrs. Stevenson told a local newspaper that her daughter attended Blinn College in Bryan, Texas. She wanted to put her education on hold to begin modeling.

Police say the girl was standing between two sets of tracks in Navasota when a BNSF Railroad train approached.

She moved out of the way of the BNSF train but was apparently unaware that a Union Pacific train was coming in the opposite direction on the other tracks and was trapped between them.

The person taking photos of the girl was not injured.

Trespassing on railroad right-of-way is illegal and can be potentially fatal. Photography on railroad property compounds the danger. Wherever there are multiple tracks there can be multiple trains. Human reaction time cannot compete with the speed of a moving locomotive.

With tourist railroads, under careful supervision, strictly following the rules, we are sometimes allowed to get up close and personal with trains. Some of us did that on the Cumbres and Toltec last October and some of us will with a tour of the Durango and Silverton at the NMRA Regional Convention this June. The Colorado Railroad Museum is another great place to visit close to home.

But, if you're not on an authorized tour or visit, stay away and stay alive.
